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RESOLUTION NO. 2012-610:

A RESOLUTION RETAINING ATTORNEY, SCOTT L. BASINGER, AS VILLAGE SOLICITOR FOR THE VILLAGE OF PANDORA, OHIO FOR THE YEARS 2012 AND 2013.

Motion was made by Mr. Hall, seconded by Mrs. Buess to place Resolution No. 2012-610 on its first reading. Voting: All Yea.

ORDINANCE NO. 533-2012: ANNUAL APPROPRIATION ORDINANCE. Motion was made by Mr. Fricke, seconded by Mr. Hall to place Ordinance No. 533-2012 on its first reading. Voting: All Yea.

David Lee and Dean Luginbill, representatives of the St. John Mennonite Church, were present to discuss the additional costs of the St. John Church project. A trench box was rented for said project and the Village's shared cost would be \$3,550. Also a temporary one-inch "blow off" line at a cost of \$1,025.00 was installed to prevent contamination as well as pressure testing of the waterline loop installed in the Industrial Park. Thus, the Village's total cost for these two items is \$\$4,575. It was the consensus of the Council for the Village to pay \$4,575 for these items.

Richard Wahl, representative of the Pandora-Gilboa School Board, presented to Council the State of Ohio has requested of school districts to share services with their villages or cities. At the present time the school and the village do share services regarding maintenance of the parks for the use of athletic events. Also the school and the village share services regarding the Community Center for athletic events as well. As of this date the potential of any additional shared services is not feasible.

The Village Administrator presented to Council a draft of proposed plat as to the location of a storm sewer line to alleviate the water problem of resident, Gary Hilty. In order for this line to be installed several easements from area residents will need to be obtained. Mayor Schlumbohm requested a letter be sent by the Village Administrator to each residence affected by this storm line prior to finalizing the plat and legal description.

Discussion was had as to the village contributing to the employees' HSA accounts for 2012. Due to additional expenses for 2011 year, motion was made by Mr. Fricke, seconded by Mr. Hall full-time employees under a family medical plan to receive \$2000, with one-half paid in January and the remainder paid in February and full-time employees under a single medical plan to receive \$1000, with one half paid in January and the remainder paid in February. Voting: Mr. Hall-Aye; Mrs. Buess-Aye; Mr. Swary-Aye; Mr. Painter-Nay; Mr. Vance-Aye; Mr. Fricke-Aye.

With no further business to discuss, the meeting was adjourned upon a motion by Mr. Vance, seconded by Mr. Hall. Voting: All Yea.

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
