RESOLUTION NO. 2012-614:

AN EMERGENCY RESOLUTION: A RESOLUTION TRANSFERRING FUNDS FROM THE GENERAL FUND TO THE STREET CONSTRUCTION, MAINTENANCE AND REPAIR FUND. Motion was made by Mr. Fricke, seconded by Mr. Painter to suspend the rules by which Resolution No. 2012-614 be read on three separate occasions. Voting: All Yea. Motion was made by Mrs. Buess, seconded by Mr. Hall to adopt Resolution No. 2012-614 as an emergency measure. Voting: All Yea.

The Village Administrator reported on the following: 1) The ash tree in the alley south of the Pandora Grain's bins on South Jefferson Street, close to the Patricia Myers' and Mark Williams' residences needs to be removed. Mr. Schneck will get quotes for said tree removal. 2) Railroad ties and stone were placed along the fence of the tennis courts to help alleviate the water retention problem. Also the cracks in the tennis court have been cleaned and ready for cold patching to seal said cracks. 3) It has been suggested to possibly have a sliding or swinging gate at the entrance of the playground. This will be discussed further with the contractor who will be doing the repair work at the playground.
4) Juveniles, who are ordered to do community service work, have cleaned up the Park area. 5) Two foreign exchange students have painted several of the hydrants. 6) The tornado siren at the Park has not been working. It has been sent in for repairs, but due to the corrosion of the circuit boards, it would need major repairs in the amount of \$1,000. A new unit costs \$1,450. Thus, Mr. Schneck has ordered a new unit for said siren. 7) Mr. Schneck will obtain quotes as to painting the EMS building. 8)Mr. Schneck entered into a 5-year contract with Cintas as to the employees uniforms and was in the process of cancelling the service with Miller Textile Service, when he was informed the Village has a 5-year contract with Miller's, which was renewed August, 2011. Mr. Schneck discussed this situation with a representative from Miller's and was decided to reduce their weekly service by \$17.00 per month, for an adjusted monthly amount of \$135.56. Cintas representative stated in lieu of the uniforms, they could provide the Village with floor mats for the Municipal Building for \$87.40 per month. Thus, the Village would pay \$222.96 per month for these services. Discussion was had as to options the Village may have with cancelling one or both of these services. One option, as stated in their respective contracts, would be to buy the employee uniforms from said service. The costs for a buy-out from each company will be presented at the next meeting.

With no further business to discuss, the meeting was adjourned upon a motion by Mr. Swary, seconded by Mr. Fricke. Voting: All Yea.
