Since we are hauling our brush to Ottawa, the Village and Village residents are eligible to obtain mulch from the Village of Ottawa at no cost. 4) Since the office area in the Krohn Street maintenance building is rather small, the rent was reduced to \$250 per month. This office will be used for personnel as to the Road 5 project. 5) Met with representatives as to electronic read water meters. Mr. Schneck will be meeting with another company this week and report to the council the comparison of these two companies.

Police Chief, Scott Stant, introduced to the Council Andrew Probst. Mr. Probst was hired as a full time police officer by the approval of Mayor Schlumbohm on April 17, 2013.

Councilman Vance reported he has submitted a classified ad for a full time maintenance worker in the area newspapers. The deadline for the Village to receive resumes will be May 3, 2013.

Mayor Schlumbohm stated he received a complaint as to an unsightly residence on Diller Street. Village Solicitor, Scott Basinger, will be sending a letter to the property owner as to this matter.

Mayor Schlumbohm was contacted by Pandora-Gilboa School Superintendent, Todd Schmutz, regarding the possibility of the school upgrading the outside athletic facilities. Some of these potential upgrades would be concession stand and restrooms at the athletic facilities on the new school property. These upgrades would be over a period of several years.
