for the installation of this tent. The Council had no objection, but to have the portion of Sherman Street blocked off in the least amount of time possible.

Kurt Sahloff, attorney for Charles Hackworth, was present to introduce himself representing Charles Hackworth as to the possibility of development of the southern portion of his property for residential housing as well as the water and sewer tap fees.

Discussion was had as to the additional cost of the Basinger Road paving project. The cost of putting stone along the berm would be \$2,500. Also the six manholes to be re-done on Basinger Road would be \$4,200. The cost of said manholes was quoted in the total 2012 street project, but was not included in the total quote for 2013. The Village Administrator will be discussing these costs with Ward Construction.

Village Solicitor, Scott Basinger, submitted a draft of a proposed letter to be sent to the Putnam County Commissioners regarding the study for a regional water and sewer district. The Council does not desire to participate in a collaborative partnership agreement as to the study, but does not have any objections for the Putnam County Commissioners seeking grant funds for said study. Also the Council would like to be informed as to the results of said study and any future developments regarding the possibility of a regional water and sewer district. It was the consensus of the Council for this letter to be sent to the Putnam County Commissioners.
