RESOLUTION NO. 2014-632: RESOLUTION ACCEPTING THE AMOUNTS AND RATES AS DETERMINED BY THE BUDGET COMMISSION AND AUTHORIZING THE NECESSARY TAX LEVIES AND CERTIFYING THEM TO THE COUNTY AUDITOR. Motion was made by Mr. Burkholder, seconded by Mr. Liechty to place Resolution No. 2014-632 on its second reading. Voting: All Yea.

Fiscal Officer, Lana Burry, stated Jodi Gerdeman has requested permission for a Homecoming Parade on October 3, 2014 to begin at 5:30 PM. The parade route would be the same as last year. Police Chief, Scott Stant, also stated Mrs. Gerdeman had contacted him as to the parade route. It was the consensus of the Council to grant permission for a Homecoming Parade on October 3, 2014.

Discussion was had as to water and sewer rates for the village. Fiscal Officer, Lana Burry, presented two scenarios regarding the increase in the water rates. One would be for the water base rate to be increased to \$14.00 and the consumption rate for the first 50,000 gallons of water would be at \$3.50 per 1,000 gallons. The second

scenario would be for the base rate at \$14.00 and the consumption rate for the first 50,000 gallons would be at the rate of \$4.00 per 1,000 gallons. Also discussion was had as to water projects, such as waterline replacements and new water tower. It was the consensus of the Council to further pursue several possible water rate increases and to present those at the next meeting.

Village Administrator, Stanley Schneck, presented to Council a resolution authorizing the Mayor to make application to the Ohio Public works Commission for the two waterline replacement projects.

Motion was made by Mr. Burkholder, seconded by Mr. Eisenbach to place Resolution No. 2014-633 on its first reading. Voting: All Yea.

Mr. Schneck also stated Steve Bockrath of Bockrath and Associates, will be at the next council meeting to present plans regarding the two waterline replacement projects.

Mr. Schneck presented a picture to Council and asked Council if the tree located on the village right-of-way at 209 East Main Street should be removed. It was the consensus of the Council to remove said tree.

The Council discussed the four-way stop at Main Street and High Street as well as Main Street and Jefferson Street. There are to be two flashing light fixtures at each location in the event one is not working. Also the four-way flashing stop light fixture at Main and Jefferson 9/9/14)
Street should be changed to an actual four-way fixture as opposed to a stop light. The Village Administrator will check on prices of these lights.
