Motion was made by Mrs. Buess, seconded by Mr. Burkholder to approve the bills as presented. Voting: All Yea.

Linda Amos of Poggemeyer Design Group, Putnam County Commissioner, John Love, Putnam County Administrator, Jack Betscher, Advisory Board members, Dave Beckett and Mike Lammers, and Attorney, Rex Huffman, were present to discuss the possible establishment of a regional water and sewer district for Putnam County. Ms. Amos gave an overview of the steps to be taken for the establishment of said District. Ms. Amos did state that even if an entity has agreed to assist in the establishment process, said entity is not obligated to become part of said District. Mr. Love and others stated one of the main reasons for this water/Sewer District is to provide services for those outlying areas in the County and for future growth. The time frame for the establishment of said District is between one to two years.

The Village Administrator reported on the following: 1) The sidewalk project between Unarco and Doug & Edna's along State Route 12 will begin within the next two weeks. 2) Proposed updated zoning map of the Village was presented to Council. There are some color code changes to be made as well as additions of areas annexed into the Village but have not yet been given a zoning classification. Mr. schneck recommended to Council the area on the west side of town which includes the school property and wetlands be zoned Agriculture. Also Mr. Schneck recommended to Council the area on the east side of town which includes the Carl Bendele property, St. John Mennonite Church, Charles Hackworth property and Hempfling property be zoned Industrial.

Motion was made by Mr. Burkholder, seconded by Mrs. Miller to accept Mr. Schneck's recommendation by which the area on the west side of town has been annexed into the Village, more specifically, Pandora-Gilboa School property and the wetlands be zoned Agriculture. Voting: All Yea.

Motion was made by Mrs. Buess, seconded by Mrs. Miller to accept Mr. Schneck's recommendation by which the area on the east side of town has been annexed into the Village, more specifically, the Carl Bendele property, St. John Mennonite Church, Charles Hackworth property and Hempfling property be zoned Industrial. Voting: All Yea.

Mr. Schneck submitted a quote from Tawa Tree Service as to several trees in the Park which need to be removed or trimmed. It was the consensus of the Council to proceed as follows: the ash trees located near the Water Plant and Playground area to be removed with the village employees cleaning up the debris and the wood be made available to the residents. The elm tree near the tennis courts be treated, if possible, for Dutch Elm disease. The pin oak tree near the bell to be trimmed only.

Mr. Schneck submitted a quote from Ward Construction as to various street and alley repairs as well as curb and gutter repairs totaling \$83,874. After some discussion, it was the consensus of the Council to do various streets, alleys and curb and gutter repairs for a total of approximately \$46,000.

Police Chief, Scott Stant, stated the National Night Out at Bluffton will be on August 5, 2014 from 6:00 to 9:00 PM. The Pandora Police Department and Riley/Pandora Fire Department will be assisting the Bluffton Police and Fire Department for this event. Chief Stant gave an overview of some of the activities for both adults and children which stresses the awareness and prevention of crime, drug and violence. Also Chief Stant stated Ted Fest will be on September 13, 2014 at the Pandora Park.

With no further business to discuss, the meeting was adjourned upon a motion by Mr. Burkholder, seconded by Mr. Liechty. Voting: All Yea.
